

DEATH ANGEL CALLS AGAIN

Mrs. Robert Caughell Joins Her Husband On the Other Side

Mrs. Robert Caughell, whose illness at the time of her husband's death gave serious uneasiness to many friends, failed to rally in the few days following his going away, and on Sunday it was learned that her condition was very serious. Not very well at the start, the hard midnight ride to her husband's bedside and the subsequent shock of her bereavement was followed by more severe illness on her return, and this developed into pneumonia, which the best efforts of physicians and nurses were powerless to stay. She died about four o'clock Tuesday afternoon.

It is inexpressably sad that three little ones, the eldest but six years, should be so suddenly bereft of the fond care of their loving parents and words cannot express the sympathy felt for the orphan children as well as for the mother and sister, who mourn the loss of one so dear.

Della Smith was born at Wheeler Grove, July 19, 1886. Her father, Lewis Smith, died while she was but a child and she grew to womanhood in the home of her stepfather, Mr. Samuel Talbott, now of Ellendale, North Dakota. Her entire life has been spent in this locality and she has always possessed the friendship and esteem of all. She graduated with honor from the Carson High School being a member of the Class of 1901. She became a successful teacher, and on November 16, 1908, she was married to Robert Caughell, who preceded her only ten days, and at about the same hour of the day.

Their home life was happy and three children came to add to its joys. Now all is changed.

She is survived by three children, her mother, Mrs. S. A. Talbott, who came from her home in the North in time to be with her in her last hours; her sister, Mrs. Wilber Nilan, of Oak and one brother, Russell Smith of Dupree, South Dak. In early life she united with the Methodist Church, of which she has been always an active member, and she went away with full confidence in the promise of the life beyond.

The funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at the home and be conducted by her pastor, Rev. E. R. Stroud. She will rest by the side of the one, to whom united in life she was not parted in death.
